Students from Ardmore School had a great time visiting Santa's Workshop!










So did Kindergarten students from **Duclos School!** They delivered the teddy bears and toys they collected for Santa's Elves.

Our students are enjoying the snow and are turning themselves into snow people at recess.

























GOOD NEWS
