

SEMESTER 2 IS UNDERWAY


We are so excited to have our building full of students again. Our attendance has received and classes are full!


Students are excited that they will be able to compete in games and tournaments starting soon.


SORTING HAT VISIT




HE BOURGOIN MIDDLE SCHOOL

AROUND OUR SCHOOL


The 1/2 class spent time building a chicken train! A lot of science, math and language arts went into this project. The 3/4 class investigating levers for science.

Kikino School strategies include:


- Begin with grade level instruction

- Ongoing staff professional development around unfinished learning









Mental Health and Wellness is important at Caslan School.




