






#### Numeracy Goal

Aurora's school plan for numeracy includes a strategy of **gamification** to enhance student engagement in building numeracy skills, confidence, and enthusiasm. Pictured here, a Grade 6 class participated in a fun new review game designed by their teacher. The class was split into two teams and faced off answering decimal-related questions. Points were awarded, but there was an added component of playing Jenga with blocks that either helped or hindered their team. Blocks included singing every word of the question, saying 'meow' at the end of every sentence, or even pulling specific, risky Jenga blocks from certain areas of the tower. Lots of laughs throughout the game that engaged students in numeracy development!







### Health & Wellness Goal



One strategy in Aurora's school plan specifically targets our transition plan for incoming Grade 4 students feeling a sense of belonging. LSAA permits only students in grades 5 through 9 to compete, and that felt particularly unwelcoming as a grade 4 through 8 school. Aurora students in grade 4 were not previously included in the extra-curricular life, so we changed that. While they cannot yet participate in LSAA competition, we've opened our practices to grade 4 students to focus on building basic movement skills, healthy attitudes of sportsmanship, and parents and students are reporting high levels of engagement and satisfaction. Pictured here is a guided scrimmage game with Light of Christ, where Grade 4 students were an important part of their team! The mentoring of our new Thunderbirds by Grade 5s and 6s was an added bonus! Connection and belonging to our school makes a huge difference for kids!

Focus: Student Mental Health & Wellness

Grades 3/4 enjoyed a Google Meet with author David Bradley, out of Las Vegas. He wrote a children's book titled *Big Head Bob*.

The message in the story is about taking what you see as your own weakness and turning it into a strength, as well as how to deal with big emotions, stresses and triggers.

Mr. Bradley also spoke to the process of becoming an author. Students were surprised, and inspired, to learn that *Big Head Bob* is based on a story he wrote when he was 8 years old!






















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Our 100 day celebration tied in well with a numeracy focus. Students used items to learn about measurement, counting in groups, and weight.




