






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Vera M Welsh / MHCB Summer Reading Project

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

Ms. Wipfli's students earned Fabrication credits for making 20 flag holders for the Canadian Flag Program with the Lac La Biche Rotary Club.


The purpose of the project is to promote the demonstration of patriotism for Canada by the subscribers and at the same time raise funds for charitable use and use in the community by The Rotary Club.

The project follows the precedent of similar successful flag projects by Rotary Clubs in the United States.

CLES Kinder students participate in weekly reading time with a Grade 3 buddy, building literacy skills and helping students feel connected and a sense of belonging.












Kindergarten and Grade 3 Reading Buddies walked together to a nearby park to read and collect leaves.

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Music and Literacy at AMS


There is a strong connection between literacy and music. We are happy to have our band program up and running again at AMS. Currently students are learning how to read sheet music for their first songs!

Literacy Composition Books and "Extreme Writing"


Students in Grade 6 enjoy taking part in Extreme Writing.
