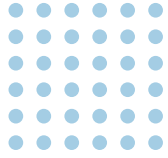

A huge thank you to our amazing teachers and volunteers who worked so hard to make this event happen! Your dedication and support made it all possible!





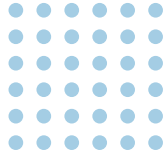




# 2nd Annual Read-a-thon

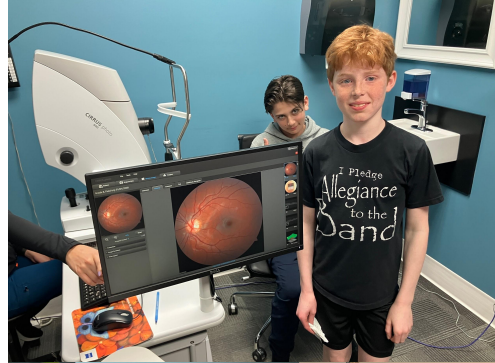
# Science Olympics

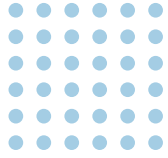


**ROYALS TIME OUT '25**

In preparation for the spring break, students got into the holiday spirit by exploring their creative talents through the creation of these beautiful traditional "Pysanky" Easter Eggs

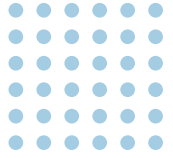

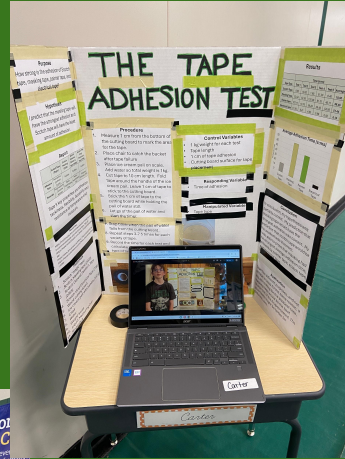


Glendon students in Grades 4–6 recently participated in the school's Science Fair.

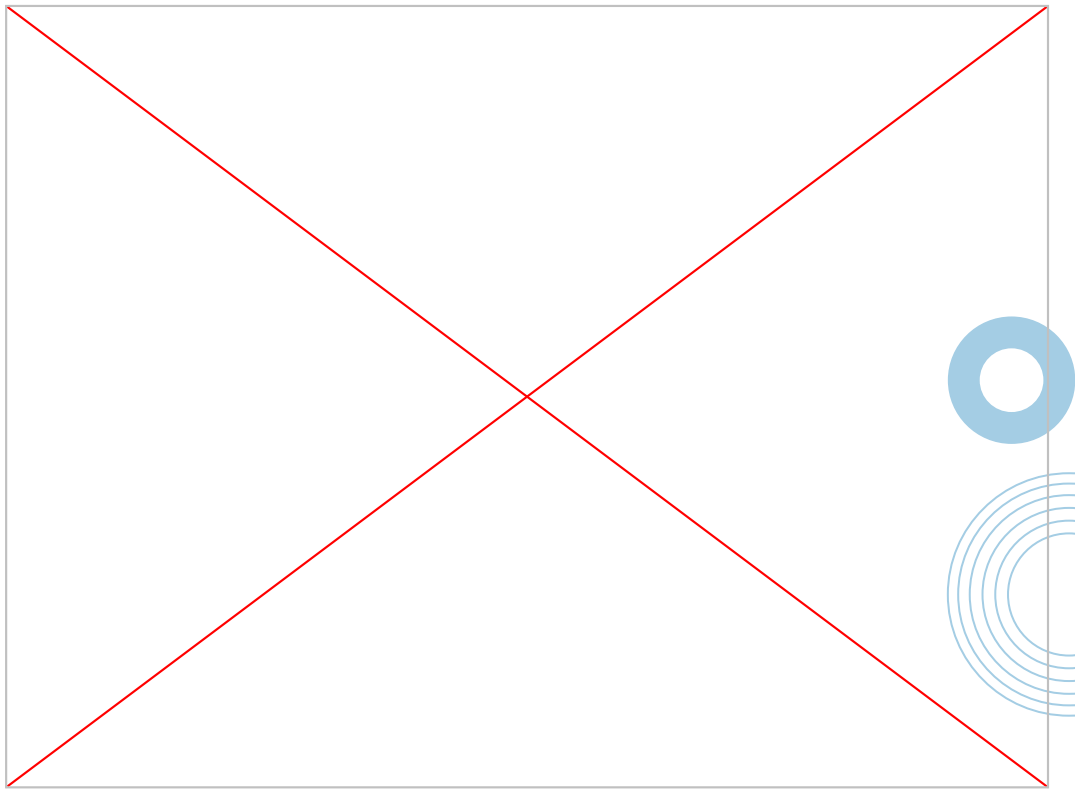
# Easter Fun!
