

### Volleyball season is underway and EPS are fierce competitors!


















### Hands-on Mathematics at EPS

### **Numeracy is Alive!**


We have created a numeracy block where the whole school focuses on numeracy activities in creative and collaborative ways! So great to watch the different grade levels working together to solve problems.

The new jerseys look great and are age appropriate for our grades five and sixes. The students will still see our running bear logo throughout the year.






